Stories behind celebrations- Personal history, personal experiences, how they celebrate, learning about different celebrations including birthdays, Diwali, Christmas, New Year. Learning about how festivals are celebrated across the world and how they have changed over time. Learning about significant stories of the past including Christmas story, other Bible stories. Looking through books and observations with the children – talking about learning from the previous day/week. Learning about significant historical events including Remembrance Day, Black History Week, Bonfire Night. Houses from around the world Look at different types of houses, how it is changed. Learn about how other people live around the world. Linking it to children in need and comic relief. 	 Celebrating different festivals throughout the year - Christmas, Easter, Diwali, New Year, Eid. Year 1 Autumn 1- My family history Looking at their own family history. Where did they come from? Looking at generation, how it has changed and job roles. Discussing how our parents and grandparents had different toys, food, schooling and travel. Spring 1- 300 years of Birmingham Looking at how the city has changed over time. Pats and present Learning about significant stories. Using photographs - that some of these old ways of life have disappeared. Summer 1- Explorers Learning about significant figures of the past. Looking at British and world history that made a difference. Year 2 Autumn 1 - Life in London Looking at what buildings were made of in the past and how the streets looked.
